## ORDINANCE NO. 133

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN PROPERTY TO THE CITY OF STILWELL, OKLAHOMA, AND CHANGING THE CITY'S BOUNDARY TO INCLUDE SUCH TERRITORY, AND DESIGNATING SUCH TERRITORY AS THE HUDSON BLOCK ADDITION TO THE CITY OF STILWELL, OKLAHOMA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STILWELL, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. That the following described real property situate adjacent to and abutting upon the present corporate limits of the City of Stilwell, Oklahoma, shall be annexed to and become part of the City of Stilwell, Oklahoma, to wit:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of the SE/4 of Section 26, Township 16 North, Range 25 East of the Indian Base and Meridian, Adair County, Oklahoma; thence South 89 degrees 12' 05" West for a distance of 1320.47 feet to a point; thence North 00 degrees 35' 08" West for a distance of 1319.54 feet to a point; thence North 89 degrees 14' 17" East for a distance of 659.56 feet to a point; thence South 00 degrees 36' 54" East for a distance of 949.66 feet to a point; thence North 89 degrees 12' 38" East for a distance of 660.00 feet to a point; thence South 00 degrees 38' 40" East for a distance of 369.35 feet to the point of beginning, containing 25.6 acres, more or less; and The following described property; The South 50.00 feet of the

The following described property; The South 50.00 feet of the SW/4, SE/4 and the South 50.00 feet of the SW/4 lying East of the center line of the Kansas City Southern Railroad right-of-way, all in Section 26, Township 16 North, Range 25 East,

a plat of which said property is attached hereto and made a part hereof as though described herein.

SECTION 2. That the real property herein described shall be designated as the **HUDSON BLOCK ADDITION** to the City of Stilwell, Oklahoma, and the boundaries of said City are herewith changed to correspond to the legal description first above given.

SECTION 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. WHEREAS, an immediate necessity exists; therefore, for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
